A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

Dear Friend,

We all face adversity in life, but some endure more hardship than others. That's why we need your help in preparing children to persevere in social, educational and career situations.

Recently Shawna*, age 11, came into our Behavioral Interventionist's office very upset, crying and screaming. She explained that some other children were making fun of her appearance.

Miss Tanisha counseled her to do something simple every day when she wakes up in the morning. She asked her to look right in the mirror and say to herself, "I AM EXCEPTIONAL!" At first Shawna was confused and didn't understand how saying something that simple could fix her problem.

Miss Tanisha explained to Shawna that she has to be responsible for knowing who she is, and that she has the power to prevent other people from making her feel bad about herself. She left Shawna with this thought: there is always going to be someone who dislikes something about you - should you let that bother you every time?

Miss Tanisha was blessed with a truly extraordinary response when Shawna walked out of the office, head held high, and shouted, "I am EXCEPTIONAL!"

We need more than \$1,868,000 per year to fund the programs that prepare children like Shawna for success. Because we are not a United Way Agency and do not solicit government funding, people like you are the heroes who assure that we can continue to serve 1,000 to 1,200 at-risk children and families annually.

By establishing an endowment, donating to the Annual Fund or sponsoring a special event, you help instill confidence and resilience in at-risk youth of Louisville. What an investment!

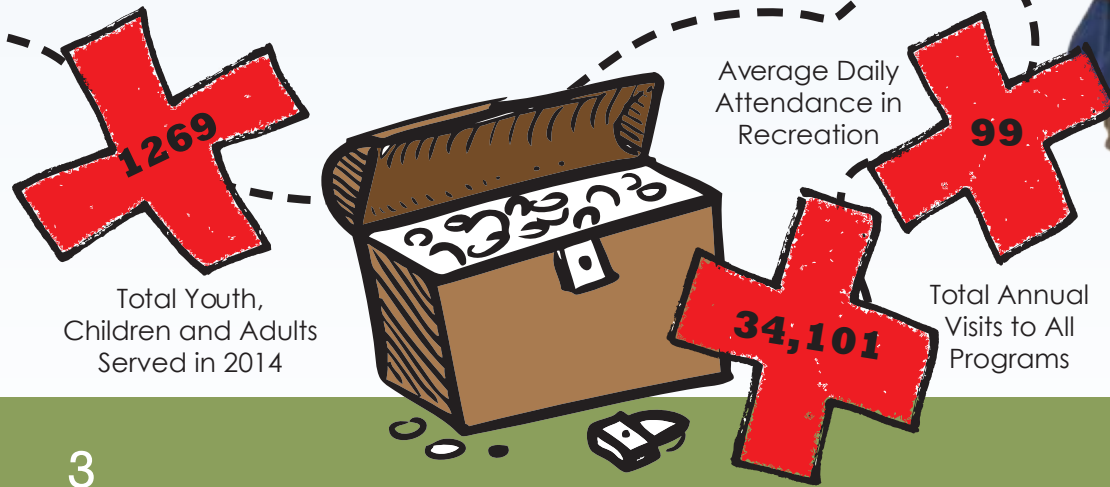

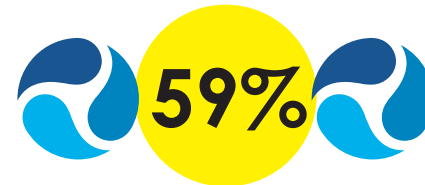


“You Don't Work Your Way Out of Poverty, You Educate Your Way Out”

PROBLEM



In our service area, 59% of children live in **poverty**. The cycle of poverty has dire consequences on education and physical and mental health.



KEY RISKS

Children whose families cannot afford **extracurricular activities** have an excess of free time...idle hands are the devil's workshop.

“Working poor” parents may not have the time, and in some cases, the educational background, to help with **schoolwork**.

When **college** is not financially possible, the cycle of poverty continues. In our service area, 54% of those 25 or older have a high school equivalency or less.

Generational poverty creates obstacles to health, education and opportunity. In our service area, 65% of households earn less than **\$30,000 per year**.

ACT

\$2,500 per day funds **Recreation and Youth Development**, which engages children in activities that have positive physical, mental and social influence.

\$1,300 per day supports **Educational Opportunities**, which helps children with homework and assesses their development with college readiness as the ultimate goal.

On average, students in the College Scholars Program receive nearly \$6,000 annually in direct financial aid from The Cabbage Patch and educational partners like the Optimist Club of Louisville and the University of Kentucky. We help bridge the financial gap and provide moral support.

994 hours per year in Family Services are spent helping parents with resume building, budgeting and other life skills.

Families improve their living situations and stress levels decrease.

1,000-1,200 Lives are profoundly **changed each year**.

“One aspect of my work that I find particularly inspiring is the love and joy I share with “Miss Marshall’s Club.” I started the group for young ladies between the ages of 11 to 13 who seek to embody the generous spirit and legacy of our founder. Through workshops and social gatherings, we cultivate civic-mindedness among children who have some of the most troubled backgrounds among our membership. Some of the girls are in foster care and many live in neighborhoods where drugs and violence are prevalent. The act of creating a safe, engaging atmosphere for these girls makes my job so meaningful and filled with everyday miracles.

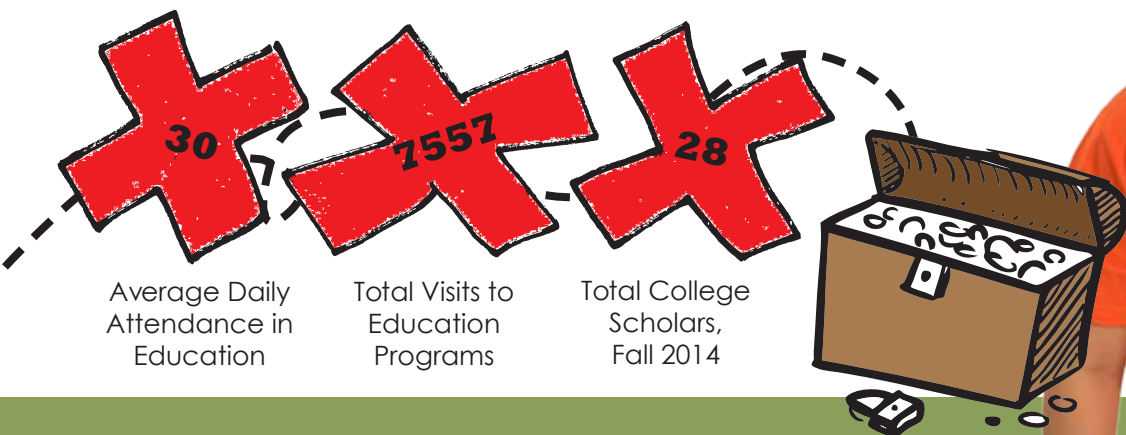
Your support of The Cabbage Patch’s educational programming allows us to explore creative approaches to learning. Because of you, we redefine the educational experience and help students overcome their obstacles and transcend their limitations.

Brayden*, age 11, has Asperger’s Syndrome, a form of autism. When he joined our history camp focusing on the Civil War, he was nearly non-verbal; clutching his knees, he sat in the corner and refused to engage staff or other children.

It took much coaxing and patience to get him to come out of his shell enough to tell us his name, but by the end of the day he had opened up to the counselor and was playing games with the group. In preparation for the Civil War reenactment that is part of our Living History camp, we engaged Brayden in cooking and sewing activities that helped him understand how children lived during the time period. By day three, he was laughing and playing like any other child!

At the weekend camping trip and reenactment, he was teaching other children to make rag dolls, dancing with strangers at the Officer’s Ball, and chatting up “President Lincoln” at the Ladies’ Auxiliary Tea Party. “It is like a he is a completely different kid,” his mother said. “I hope other children like him find a place like the Cabbage Patch!”

BOB BRAUNBECK, EASY RECYCLE COMPANY

You have probably heard the old saying, “reduce, reuse, recycle,” but if you chat with Bob Braunbeck, it takes on a new meaning. “The first two terms come first – they are the most important,” he says. Before Braunbeck founded Easy Recycle Company, based in New Albany, Indiana, he gained insight about the delicate ecosystem while working as a helicopter pilot and director of aerial photography for explorer Jacques Cousteau. His enthusiasm for maintaining the environment led him to create a business model that not only benefits the planet, but also the local community.

Braunbeck’s customers pay him to recycle in the best way, not the cheapest way. The company is supported entirely by fees from pickup and sorting, so any proceeds from materials he sells go to local charities. The Cabbage Patch has been fortunate to be a major beneficiary of Easy Recycle Company’s unique system thanks to Braunbeck’s belief in our academic assistance for at-risk children and families. “It’s sad when people have to think about income before education,” says Braunbeck.

Can you see the similarities between an endangered ecosystem and an impoverished community? Each one holds immense potential for those who dare to hope and work to heal. It is visionaries like Bob Braunbeck who make a brighter future possible, and we are thankful for his ability to think outside the box!

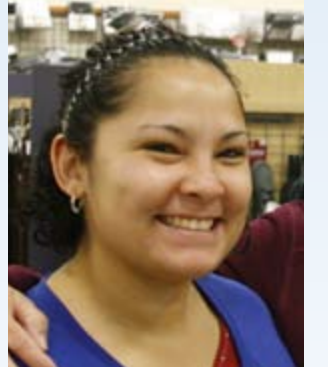

Part of what makes The Cabbage Patch such an inspiring place is the sense of community that thrives here. No challenge seems too large when children and families exchange ideas with others who have met the same adversity with confidence and ambition.

Each month throughout the year, parents of children who are active in Patch programs gather for a Patch Parents meeting, where they have the opportunity to learn about a variety of topics that enhance their quality of life. Many meetings feature local experts who offer advice on topics like tenant rights, disease prevention and budgeting.

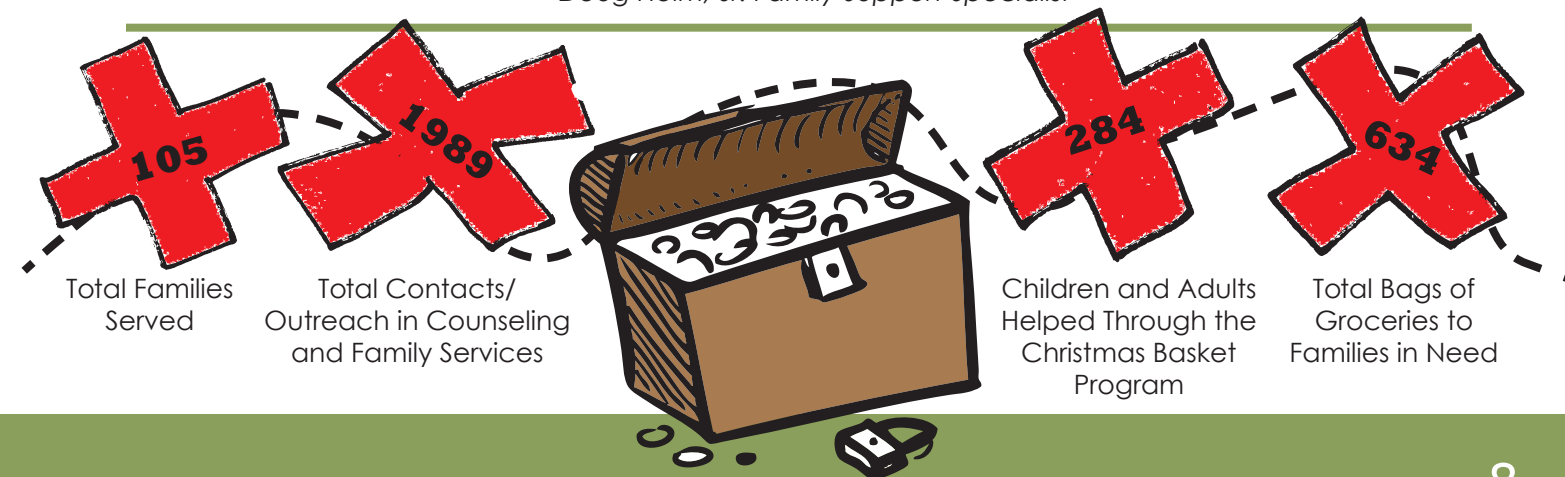
Patch Parent Gloria has been part of the program for approximately two years and loves that the meetings offer the opportunity to spend time with her children at The Patch. “Going to the meetings shows my children that I'm involved, that I'm part of their Patch community,” she says. Her favorite meeting included a workshop with Project Warm, a local weatherization service. “With our old house, there are leaks everywhere,” she said. “The supplies they gave us helped to reduce my heating bills. I use everything I get from the Patch Parent meetings.”



“I am constantly inspired by the teamwork that helps our families follow their dreams. So many parents come to us feeling like they are alone in their struggles, but at The Cabbage Patch they find a place where true ministry meets the road of life. I tell clients that I believe that God created places like The Cabbage Patch to help them during the difficult times

that they are experiencing. Cooperation is key, and results begin with our clients. First, they must commit to their goals before we can devise a plan for success. It takes courage to change, but our families find encouragement at The Patch and in one another.”

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT:

KIM GLASS MEMORIAL

The Cabbage Patch family honors the life of Kimberly "Kim" Hazelwood Glass, a modest yet immensely talented alumna who was received into God's arms on December 27, 2014. Kim started out as an active Patch member in early elementary school. As she developed her skills as an architect in her adult years, she made the transition to leadership as a Board member and a driving force behind The Patch's facility expansion which was completed in 2009.

As a young Patch participant, Kim was active in Leadership Development, Teen Club, softball and basketball and the High Adventure program. As part of High Adventure, Kim pushed her boundaries by completing a 100 mile canoe trip in Missouri and exploring the Canadian wilderness on a fishing trip. While her courage and determination pushed her to excel in such adventures, she is also remembered as the gentle soul who didn't really want to catch any fish; she was afraid of hurting them.

Kim's influence has enriched the enduring legacy of The Cabbage Patch. She was the first College Scholar in The Patch's history, and recently she and her husband established the Kim and Doyle Glass Educational Opportunities Fund to help ensure that future generations would benefit from educational attainment. She served on the Board of Directors for six years, and was the primary architect on The Patch's expansion that added 19,000 square feet of space for educational, recreational and social services.

"Kim's service to The Patch is in keeping with the tradition of Miss Marshall (founder) and Mr. Chin (long time staff member)," says Rod Napier, Director of Programs and Facilities. "She had a strong, engaging presence that commanded respect, and her motivation was always about helping others."

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT:

JUDY BUCKLER AND MEGAN BRODERICK: SOWING THE SEEDS OF CHANGE

In 2010, the University of Louisville published a study called "The State of Food: A Snapshot of Food Access in Louisville" that examined inequities in the food system in our communities. The report shows that West Louisville is a "food desert" with inadequate access to grocery stores selling fresh food. West Louisville and East Downtown are underserved by supermarkets, but convenience stores and fast food restaurants abound in these areas and offer foods with low nutritional value to residents. Many of the people in these communities rely on public transportation and do not have convenient means to travel to obtain their groceries. Because these are the communities that we serve, our gardening and cooking program, Seed to Table, offers a fun and practical solution.



Volunteer Judy Buckler is a key volunteer who has been contributing her time and expertise to the Seed to Table program for more than 15 years. Though she was initially attracted to the program by the gardening activities, she has added cooking to her repertoire and the children love to work with her in the kitchen. Program participants often call Miss Judy "Nana," and there is another young lady calling her that at The Patch these days, as her granddaughter Megan Broderick joined Seed to Table as a volunteer in September 2014.

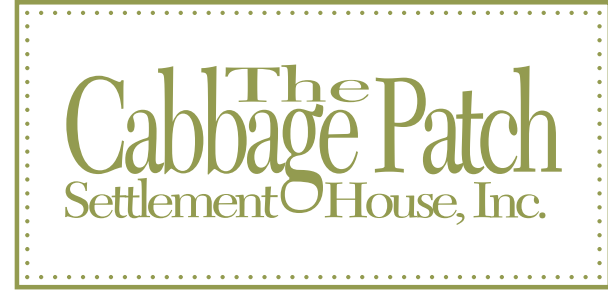
"I love being with the children, and volunteering is a great opportunity for my Nana and I to work together," says Megan, a freshman at Mercy Academy.

Judy has earned the title of Master Gardener through the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Office. After staying on the waiting list for five years, she completed 12 weeks of classes, an extensive final exam and 30 hours in gardening projects to complete her training! The Patch children are fortunate to learn from such an expert the techniques that grow a bounty of crops, even in a small urban space.

"I love working with children who have never seen a seed sprout or come to fruit, so that they can see what is possible," says Judy. "Gardening in childhood can lead to a lifetime of gardening, and higher fruit and vegetable consumption when they grow the food themselves."

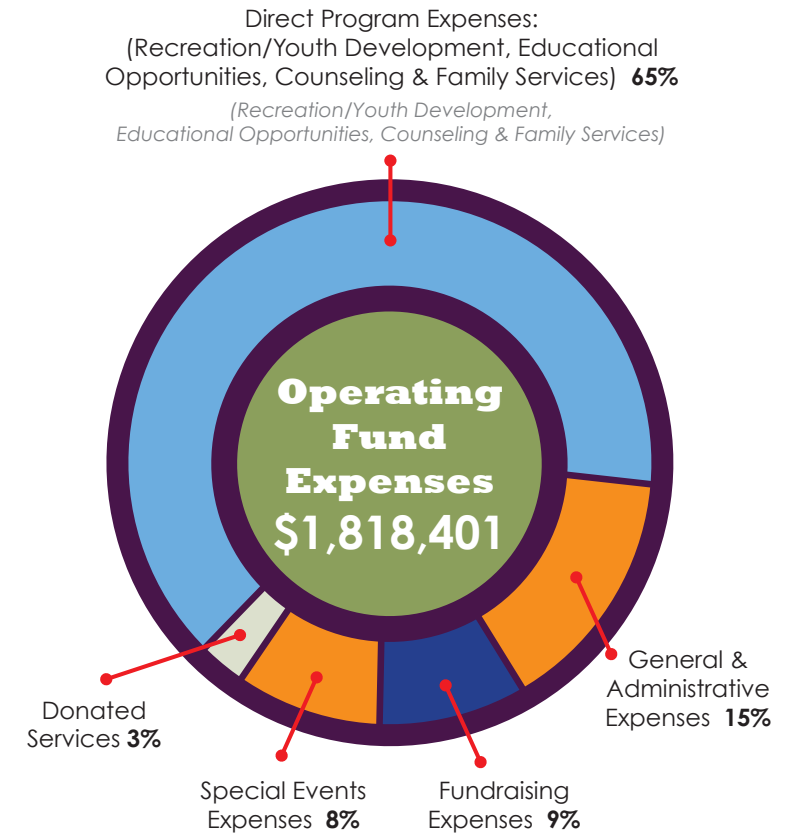

Total expenses for all funds for the fiscal year ended April 30, 2013 was \$2,080,813 including Depreciation expense of \$258,333.

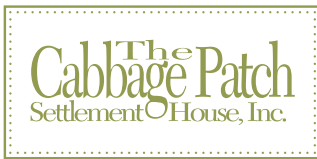
