Donating Goods

The need for donated goods varies throughout the year at The Cabbage Patch, but typical examples of supplies frequently needed to help those served by The Cabbage Patch include:

Nonperishable items for the food pantry are an invaluable resource to families going through a hard time. In 2012, The Cabbage Patch Counseling & Family Services program distributed more than 1,000 bags of groceries to the families in need.
