In 2020, the families of The Cabbage Patch found themselves needing more support than ever. In fact, we all faced unprecedented challenges in the midst of the pandemic. We quickly found ways to help each other and together, we emerged with a new sense of gratitude for our community. The same can be said for our Patch families

FAMILY DEVELOPMENT

“Mr. Calvin, how long do you think this will go on?” The conversation took place by phone rather than in the Family Development office, where there are plenty of boxes of tissues for such moments. Amber was on week three of being laid off from her job due to COVID-19 restrictions, and there was a lot of uncertainty about the possibility of businesses opening again. While she was worried about not working due to loss of income, she was also worried about going back to work since she worked in a doctor’s office. The idea of checking in patients seemed daunting during a pandemic.

Mr. Calvin, The Patch’s Counseling and Family Development Manager, had no answer, of course. No one could answer that question. So he asked a different one: “What do you need?”

Amber’s concerns were mounting. Her old car was breaking down and each repair left a big hole in her budget, which was a great accomplishment, but she was worried about keeping up with possible maintenance issues. She was worried about being able to put food on the table when she had lost her income and her transportation.

The Patch helped Amber pay a utility bill and provided her with food so she could save on those expenses. Later on, the opportunity came up for a generous corporate partner to provide Amber with a newer, more reliable car. As we all learned to navigate life with COVID-19, Amber became more comfortable with the idea of PPE and safety procedures, and felt confident when she was called back to work. 2020 didn’t have a lot of happy endings, but thanks to your support of The Patch, Amber’s story is one of the inspiring ones.

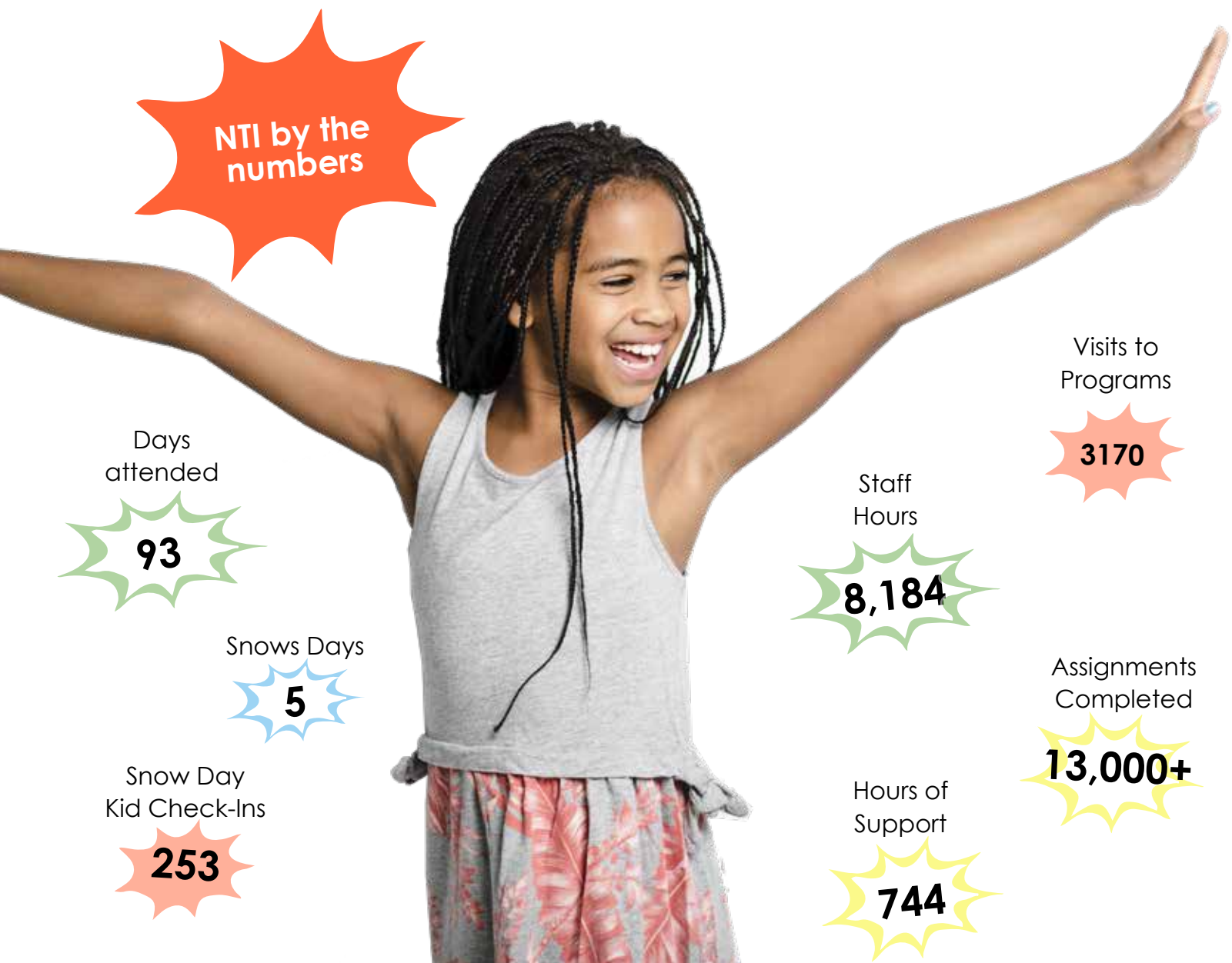
EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES:

When Amber's daughter Jayla* started non-traditional instruction (NTI) at The Patch, she seemed completely disinterested in school. She would usually breeze through her advanced math problems and compete well in debate club, but she was missing assignments and seemed to have lost all motivation. Her lowest grade was her dance class. The lack of in-person instruction can be difficult for most classes, but it is especially difficult with classes such as dance and P.E. where hands-on instruction works best.

To keep her motivated and focused, an education staff member volunteered to do some of her dance sessions with her. Jayla was

able to have fun and learn as she helped the staff member with some of the moves. After a few sessions dancing with the staff member, Jayla made and turned in several dance videos on her own, which is challenging but essential to earning a good grade in the class. Haley excelled with individual attention from the staff and soon began to work well independently. After a few more weeks of NTI support at The Patch, her grade point average and her confidence improved dramatically.

Thank you for helping young people like Jayla get moving and get excited about learning again!



RECREATION:

When Amber got the news that summer camps would be able to operate within COVID restrictions, she was thrilled. While she was thankful to have a job again, the uncertainty of how her daughter, Jayla, would spend her summer was very stressful. Just knowing that there would be a safe, reliable and fun place for Jayla to spend her days was a great relief.

Haley decided to try something new that summer. Volleyball camp is one of The Cabbage Patch's most popular camps, but Jayla had usually shied away from it.

"When I first entered the camp, I was a little scared and really didn't know how to do anything. By the 3rd day I learned how to correctly pass, and set the ball!" Jayla says.

Jayla has joined the volleyball team at her school, and her new favorite sport has helped her build confidence and develop skills like time management, teamwork, goal setting and resilience. She has come a long way, but she will still tell you that she has room for improvement.

"Still to this day I can't really spike the ball, but I'll continue to practice!" Jayla says.

Outdoor adventures like canoeing and long distance biking helped Destiny learn that she has the strength to overcome any challenge, especially with her friends cheering her on. Caroline Taylor Davis’ legacy assures that Destiny and countless children after her will have opportunities to grow and shine.

Did you know?

When you name a charity as a beneficiary to receive your IRA or other retirement assets upon your death, rather than donating retirement assets during your lifetime, the benefits multiply:

- Neither you and your heirs nor your estate will pay income taxes on the distribution of the assets.
- Your estate will need to include the value of the assets as part of the gross estate but will receive a tax deduction for the charitable contribution, which can be used to offset the estate taxes.
- Because charities do not pay income tax, the full amount of your retirement account will directly benefit the charity of your choice.
- It’s possible to divide your retirement assets between charities and heirs according to any percentages you choose. You have the opportunity to support a cause you care about as part of your legacy.

During the pandemic, we could not have volunteers in the building regularly, but many generous supporters reached out time and time again to offer assistance. Many volunteers made large contributions to our food pantry, put together gift baskets for families and kids, or tutored some of our students digitally.

We had a special circumstance that brought one volunteer inside our NTI remote learning academy. Makayla* enrolled in NTI support nearly a month into the semester, and we found that she was 68 assignments behind! Because she was so overwhelmed, her behavior issues were just magnifying the academic struggle. Staff members knew that Angie's only hope was going to be a dedicated tutor that could work with her, and only her. But who could it be?

Kit Davis is a former Cabbage Patch Board member who is a regular volunteer. She had offered her assistance even during the pandemic, and with Makayla's arrival, it was time to take Kit up on her offer. With patience, care, and a purse full of butterscotches (Makayla's favorite) they formed a very special bond! Now Kit comes three days a week, several hours a day. Kit never gives up on her, or makes her feel like she is incapable. Instead, Kit empowers her and reassures her that she is capable of anything.

Total expenses for all funds for the fiscal year ended April 30, 2020 were \$2,512,904 including Depreciation expense of \$248,937.

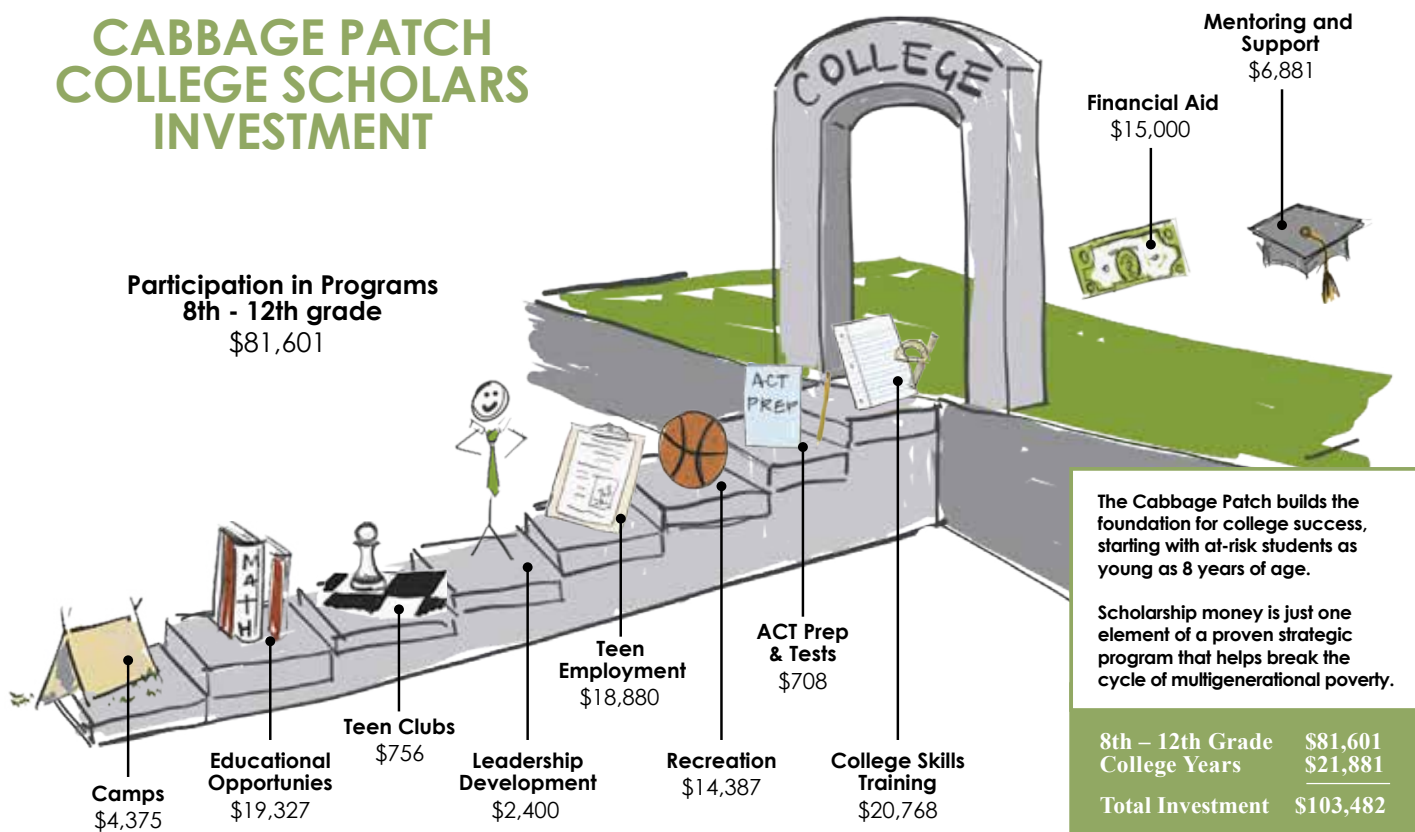

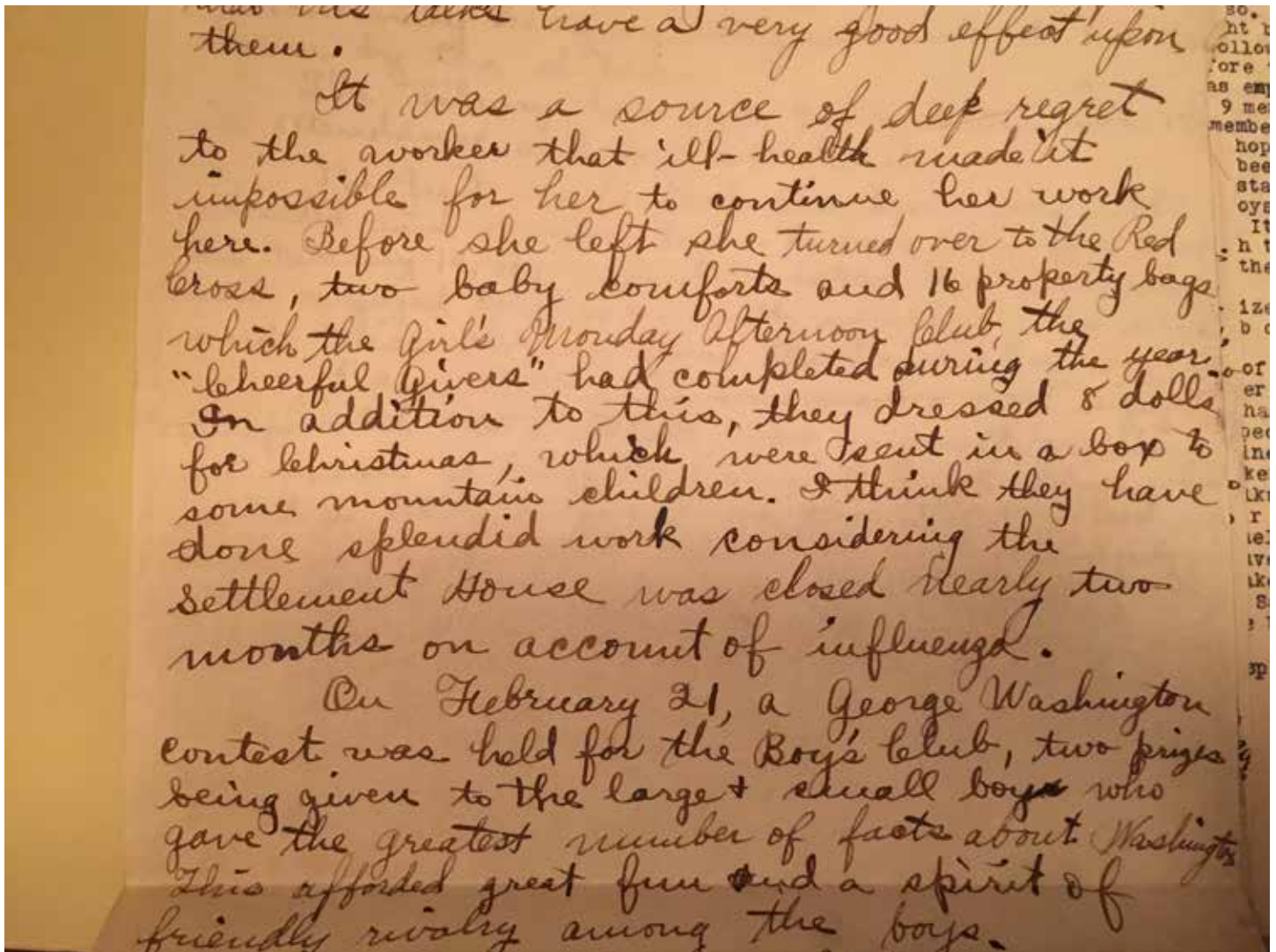

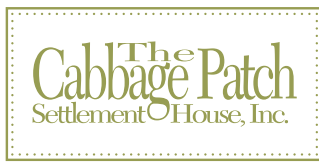
