FAMILY DEVELOPMENT

*It only takes one spark of hope
to change someone's life.*

In 2014, Rev. Calvin Holloway, The Patch's Manager of Family Development, first met Melanie and her daughter. The two were living with Melanie's father as Melanie, a single mom, was struggling to balance life and work. She was taking care of her dad, attending nursing school, working 20-25 hours per week, and raising her daughter who is a Patch member. Melanie had a lot to juggle, but she was determined.

Over the next few years, Melanie continued in her program, received a nursing degree, and secured a full-time position. In the midst of the pandemic, she saw an opportunity to create a brighter future for her family so pursued traveling nursing assignments in California and Louisiana while her daughter stayed home with family.

Once she returned back to Louisville, one of the things she decided to do was to return some of the generosity she had received. Just as The Patch had once helped her, she reached out to our organization to donate items for our food pantry.

"The nursing assignments paid me very well, and I saved my money," she told Rev. Holloway. "I wanted to find a way to give back to The Cabbage Patch."

With a new spark of hope, Melanie's next goal is to purchase her own home and start the process of paying off her student debt. Thanks to your continued support, we are offering families, like Melanie's, the hope they are looking for to turn their dreams into reality.

Rev. Holloway says it best, "We never know how the assistance we provide to a family can have an impact on their future."

The Cabbage Patch Comes to Life



While the pandemic has been stressful for many of us, it has been especially tough for our students. As many of our Cabbage Patch members transitioned back into school, we noticed they felt overwhelmed by the stresses of the change and balancing their schoolwork. The combination of these stressors began taking a toll on their emotions. Fortunately, we have a talented staff team that helps our members work through these issues.

As we went into the fall, we saw an overall behavioral trend of students struggling to manage their raw feelings, which occasionally led to them acting out. Change can be overwhelming for children and youth, and can result in conflict among those who are unable to regulate their emotions fully.

Staff member Micah Wilson has been able to step in to help our members. She teaches important coping lessons and life skills, like counting to ten so that you don't respond in anger, putting yourself in someone else's shoes, and focusing on what scripture says about how we treat others. When implemented, these lessons have proven to be successful with the students and have led to a decrease in emotionally charged behavior.

While the pandemic continues, we know these are lessons we'll be working on with our students for some time to come. We will continue to work together to open the eyes and minds of "small people" having big feelings and leave them with helpful tools and a better perspective.

Love. It changes things.

In August 2021, we were finally able to reopen our doors to new members, some of whom had been on the waiting list for over a year due to COVID-19. We were thrilled to shine our light again on families and welcome them to The Patch.

We wanted to simplify the enrollment process for families, so we digitized and streamlined our new member process to make it easier for parents/guardians to complete the forms on their own time. We look forward to watching these new members grow with us as we encourage them to reach their potential.

We also restarted all levels of our Leadership Development Program this past year, something our members were very excited about. Young Leaders (ages 8-10) and Junior Leaders (ages 11-12) met twice a week and started their newly developed “Fruit of the Spirit” Journals; Teen Leaders met weekly and began working on service hours; and finally Teen Employees met bi-monthly and worked daily. We were thankful to get into a routine again with our students!

One student in particular who staff members at The Patch noticed leadership potential in was Jerome, a well-liked young man. Our team invited him to join the Junior Leaders program, but Jerome was skeptical, especially when tasked to fill out the “Love” section in his Spirit Journal. However, after his second meeting, Jerome was hooked. During a discussion on new ways to show love, Jerome said he could be more inclusive to new members of The Patch.

“Normally, I don’t invite the ‘newbies,’ but it could be a good way to make them feel like they belong,” said Jerome. “Belonging is a kind of love, too, and it is one I can show kids here.”

We are so happy to help students feel this sense of belonging once again and to be able to guide them toward a path with a bright future.


PATCH PARTNERS AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

Total Assets at April 30, 2021 were \$31,407,612 including \$4,786,081 in Property & Equipment (net of depreciation) and \$25,969,654 in Endowments/Investments/Perpetual Trusts. Total revenue for all funds for the fiscal year ended April 30, 2021 was \$3,121,123 (Annual fund revenues of \$2,240,145; Contributions to endowments & property funds of \$1,140,887; Net endowment/perpetual trusts investment income/gains (losses) of \$5,783,448 and other revenues (expenses) of \$19,600.

Total expenses for all funds for the fiscal year ended April 30, 2021 was \$2,392,698 including Depreciation expense of \$240,997. Ending Net Assets were \$31,225,418.

While at The Patch, Dave said three teachers in particular – Mr. Chin, Mr. Cooksey, and Mr. Dietch – all had a great impact on him, and he admired and respected all three. He also learned important lessons that he carries with him today.

"The Patch taught me structure, the importance of rules, and being on time," said Dave "The Patch also taught me the concept of teamwork and working toward a common goal."

Dave and his wife have three children and will celebrate their 30th anniversary this June. He now gives back to The Patch by donating a portion of his earned fees from his real estate company, Champion Properties.
