



Empowering Our Youth Through Education

Love manifests itself in numerous ways here at The Cabbage Patch, and one of its most profound expressions is through the engagement of our members in our Educational Opportunities department. In a landscape where academic struggles persist and reports from news outlets across the country highlight the ongoing decline in academic achievement, particularly within marginalized and communities of color, our members at The Patch continue to defy the odds, demonstrate growth, and thrive. Our education programs have seen a remarkable 15% increase in average attendance in 2023.

But beyond that, it's the individual stories that truly showcase the impact of the Education Department. Take Maya* for instance, who joined The Patch in 8th grade. Initially struggling with homework, Maya's journey with us was transformative. Through personalized tutoring and encouragement from our Education team, Maya has not only improved academically, but she is also demonstrating greater resilience and independence in tackling challenging subjects and has developed a deeper understanding of complex concepts. This growth enables her to complete her high school work more efficiently and accurately.

For Maya, The Patch isn't just about mastering subjects; it is a place of belonging and growth. "The Cabbage Patch has helped me grow in more than just my education," Maya states, "It has helped me come out of my shell and talk to people." She further credits our staff for teaching her the importance of learning beyond just getting the right answers. "It's about learning how to figure out everything step by step. The staff are very supportive and loving. They make me feel comfortable and at home."

In Maya's story and countless others, we see the profound impact love, along with support of education, academic success, and personal growth have on our members. The Patch is changing lives and building futures with hope and possibility.

Cultivating Leadership with Accountability

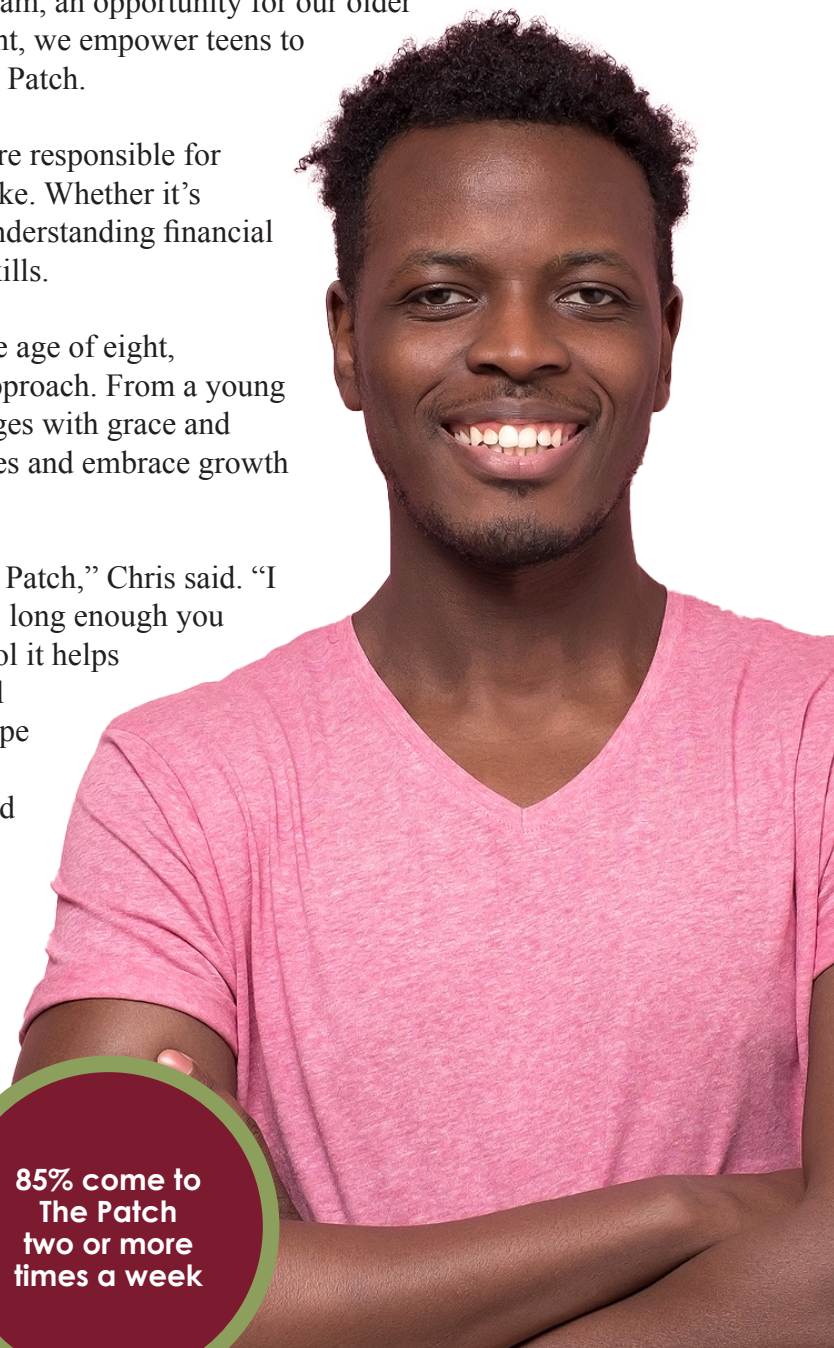
At The Cabbage Patch, we understand that successful child development is the result of several key ingredients blended. Love and unwavering support are paramount, but another crucial element is accountability. At the heart of our approach lies the belief that boundaries, coupled with compassion, provide the scaffolding for growth. In this setting, when mistakes occur, as they inevitably do, we view them not as setbacks but as opportunities for learning and resilience. Our Behavior Specialist collaborates with members to craft and create personalized behavior plans, guiding them back onto the path of success within our programs. This commitment to accountability extends to our Teen Leadership Program, an opportunity for our older members. By incentivizing consistency and engagement, we empower teens to embrace responsibility and leadership roles within The Patch.

Teen Leaders are not expected to be perfect, but they are responsible for the consequences of the choices and decisions they make. Whether it's communicating effectively, preparing for college, or understanding financial literacy, our programs equip teens with essential life skills.

Chris*, a longstanding Patch member who joined at the age of eight, exemplifies the benefits of our loving accountability approach. From a young member to a Teen Leader, Chris has navigated challenges with grace and determination. His willingness to acknowledge mistakes and embrace growth and redemption embodies the spirit of our program.

"I wanted to become a Teen Leader to help kids at The Patch," Chris said. "I almost lost my spot, but I kept going. If you come here long enough you can start working here. When you get out of high school it helps to have job experience." With his testament to personal improvement, he exemplifies the type of growth we hope to foster in every child that comes through our doors. His journey underscores the impact of perseverance and personal accountability on long-term success.

Supporting Household Stability

The Bible offers a profound reminder from the teachings of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark: to love our neighbors as ourselves. This principle, foundational to our work in Family Development at The Cabbage Patch, echoes through actions and initiatives we have undertaken this past year.

Loving others is expressed in many ways. Whether it's compassionate and encouraging words shared by dedicated staff with a grieving parent, affirmations given to struggling caregivers, or the tangible assistance provided to those facing health or financial hardships, our mission remains clear: to show the love of Jesus in practical ways.

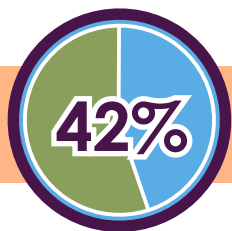
Family Development collaborates with many who are facing significant health challenges that profoundly affect their financial situations. Most of our clients are hourly wage earners rather than salaried employees. Consequently, when they're unable to work, they lose out on income.

One example of someone facing these challenges coupled with our commitment to help those in great need is Ava,* a Cabbage Patch mother facing a health crisis which threatened her family's stability. Due to hospitalization and resulting job loss, the ripple effects were devastating on their finances. Yet, through the collective support of local churches, businesses, and generous individuals across Louisville, Family Development was able to help in a practical way by providing vital assistance. From food and household supplies to school essentials, a Thanksgiving meal bag, and Christmas Partner Program, our assistance touched lives and offered hope in adversity.

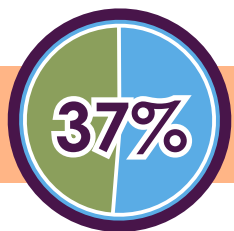
Ava's story serves as a testament to the transformative power of love in action. In 2023 alone, we served 275 individuals and 61 families in our Christmas Partner Program. 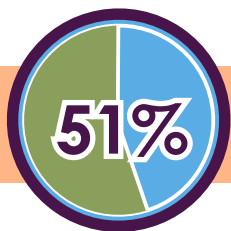
In The Cabbage Patch Service Area:

Roosevelt Chin: A Legacy of Giving, Learning, and Lifelong Impact

The words of Roosevelt Chin echo through the halls of The Cabbage Patch, inspiring both young and old with their timeless wisdom: “You don’t work your way out of poverty, you educate your way out.” This profound mantra, now etched and inscribed onto the walls of our Educational Opportunities building, serves as a beacon of hope and empowerment for generations of Patch youth.

For over five decades, Mr. Chin poured his heart and soul into The Patch, leaving an undeniable mark as a youth participant, teen employee, and beloved staff member. A true saint of a person during his life, his impact was immense because he had unwavering dedication, a magnetic personality, and truly loved The Patch kids. He worked closely with founder Louise Marshall and was a guiding light for many, with countless testimonies and a common sentiment echoed by many: “Mr. Chin changed my life.” Through it all, the driving force and common thread for Roosevelt Chin was his deep desire to share God’s love with the young people he served.

In recognition of his 50 years of service to youth in Louisville, The Cabbage Patch Board of Directors established the Roosevelt Chin Educational Opportunities Fund in 1998. This enduring fund, sustained by the generosity of those touched by his legacy, continues to support the welfare and development of children and families to this day.

Through named funds like the Roosevelt Chin Educational Opportunities Fund, we honor the memory of those who have made a lasting impact on our community. These gifts not only sustain and support our ministry today, but also pave the way for and ensure that future generations to come will have the opportunity to “educate their way out” of poverty and realize their God-given potential.

Patch Alumni: Impacting Our Community

The alumni of The Cabbage Patch are a wonderful group who reflect and embody what makes our community special. Their ongoing dedication and involvement in The Patch, whether through board service, employment as a staff member, financial support, or volunteerism, is nothing short of inspirational. Then there are individuals like Louisville District 6 Metro Councilman Phillip Baker, whose spirit of service and commitment extends far beyond our walls. As a proud Patch member, Councilman Baker, who also works for the Jefferson County Public Schools as a Family Resource Counselor, stands as a shining example of the transformative impact The Patch has on its alumni.

Here is what Councilman Baker said in his own words about his experience at The Patch:

What was the value of your experience?

I was a member of The Patch from ages 14 to 18, and it was so valuable to me, more than anybody would ever know. It is a challenging time when you are a teenager, even when you have parents who are involved. You're still trying to find yourself, figure out life, and decide what kind of man you're going to be.

The Cabbage Patch laid the foundation for that, and it always taught me character. There was a saying that stuck with me that I learned from a staff member, that "my next was better than my now." No matter what situation I was going through in the moment, if I picked myself up and made sure the next decision that I made was a better one, then there could be progress. I have carried that with me throughout my life.

In addition, I was an athlete – a football player and an all-state wrestler – and managing those commitments and academics was a heavy load. Having people at The Patch to talk to outside of my family was a huge benefit. Sometimes you just feel overwhelmed when you're that age and you can't quite see what tomorrow looks like, and Patch staff encouragements got me to that next day. I think those conversations really changed the trajectory of where I was going.

There was a saying that stuck with me that I learned from a staff member, that "my next was better than my now." No matter what situation I was going through in the moment, if I picked myself up and made sure the next decision that I made was a better one, then there could be progress.

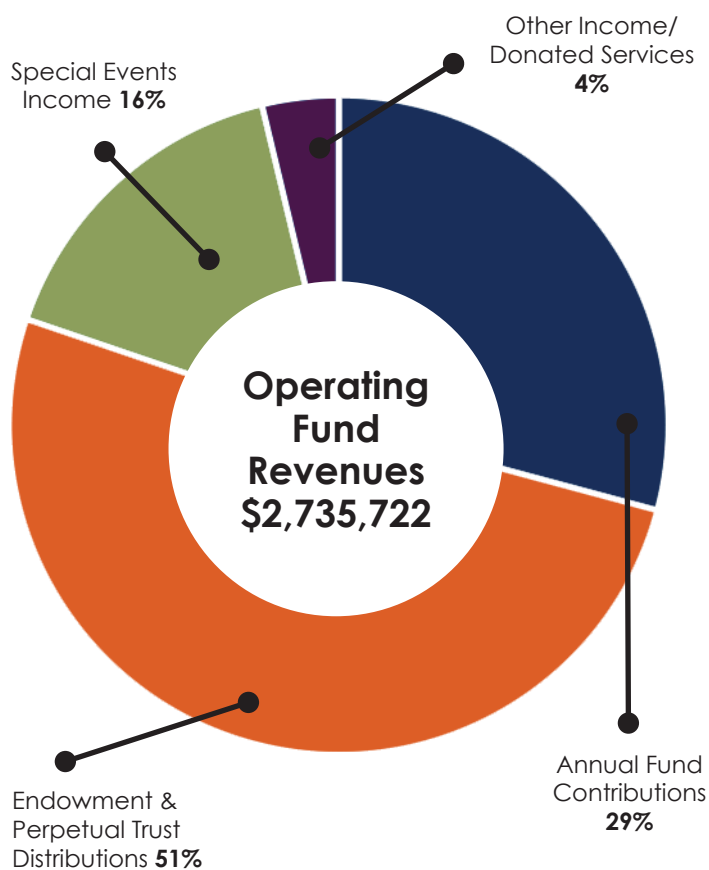
Do you have any message for Patch supporters?

I am not special. I am just a person who people took time with and invested in, whether it be from a donation, a volunteer that came by and shared a kind word. 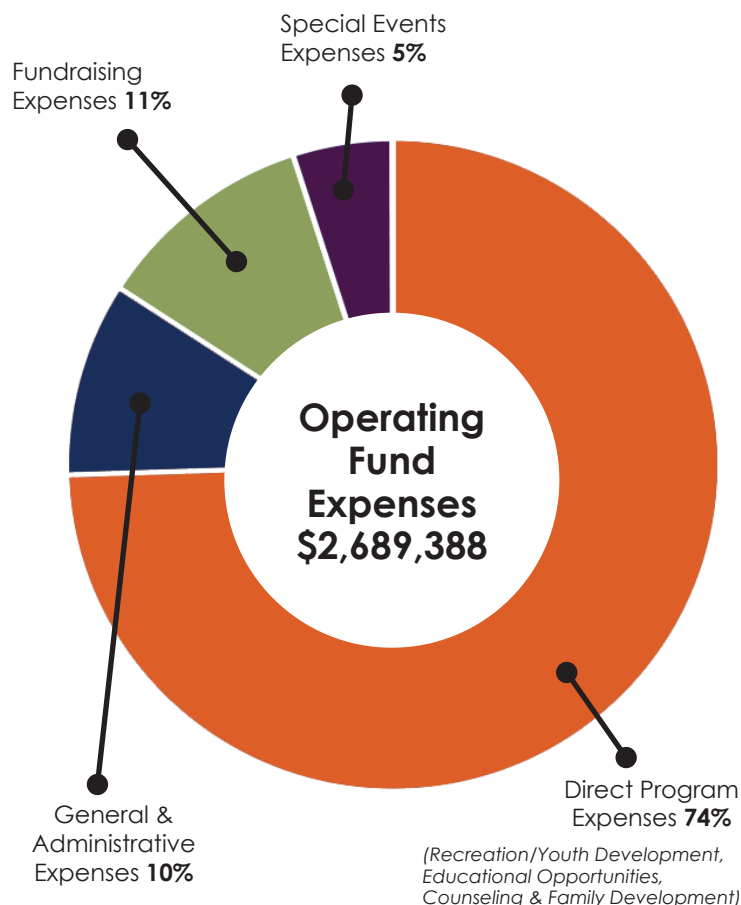

Total Assets at April 30, 2023 were \$29,149,668, including \$4,436,483 in Property & Equipment, \$16,406,596 in Investments, and \$7,793,038 in Perpetual Trusts.

During the year ending April 30, 2023, Net Investment loss was \$100,545.

For the year, \$421,139 was distributed from the Trusts, decreasing the value of the Trusts by \$233,603.

The Endowment Net Assets decreased by \$280,922, with an increase in Unrestricted Endowment Assets of \$163,928.

Total Net Assets at the year ending April 30, 2023 were \$28,968,483.

The Cabbage Patch is a BBB Accredited Charity meeting all 20 Standards for Charity Accountability and adheres to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP).
