Together, we have expanded after-school programming through collaborations with The West End School, Nativity Academy, and Jefferson County Public Schools like Cochran Elementary. We've also deepened our work with other Louisville nonprofits—partnering with Dare to Care Food Bank to provide daily meals, Big Brothers Big Sisters to enhance mentoring, and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to connect faith to life.

Thanks to the generosity of foundations and donors, we have taken our fine arts programming to new heights. In Visual and Performing Arts, we've expanded to create more opportunities for young people to build confidence and explore creativity. This year also marked the launch of an innovative Summer Camp education program, ensuring students return to school ready to succeed.

Guiding all of this is The Patch Way—our vision for pursuing excellence in all things, grounded in the Biblical principles of love of God and neighbor, and lived out through our values of communication, care, and trust. We've also strengthened our ability to measure and demonstrate impact, ensuring that every investment in The Patch makes a real and lasting difference.

At the heart of The Cabbage Patch are the relationships we build with our children and youth—their current and future success is always our focus. Thank you for standing with us as we continue to create brighter futures through education, enrichment, and faith.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN 2024

College and Career Development

The Cabbage Patch continues to provide educational support and programming for students through our flagship College Scholars Program. In 2024, 39 Patch members received assistance, ensuring they had access to necessary resources and guidance while pursuing higher education. With donor and community support, career development programming has been expanded to include our high schoolers, with over 30 teens participating in activities such as guest speaker events, a trip to the University of Cincinnati, and money management programs.

Customized Youth Development

To meet student needs more effectively, Patch Learning Plans were introduced to provide individualized support for Patch kids. Additionally, the S.T.R.E.A.M. (Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, Art, and Math) Learning Retention Program was launched to help 8 to 12 year-olds prevent summer learning loss. New partnerships were developed with Raptor Rehab, Bricks 4 Kidz and the Louisville Free Public Library to bring hands-on educational experiences to S.T.R.E.A.M.

Teen Programming

Teen Programming also saw significant growth, with the creation of Teen Debate Club, Teen Café and the continuation of ACT Prep Jr. classes. With 45% of Cabbage Patch members being 13 and older, these initiatives are designed to better equip members for future success. The Cabbage Patch provides opportunities for learning and skill building, remaining focused on the academic and personal development of Patch members.

A dedicated Teen Room was also created to provide a focused space for teen members. Teen employees and leaders remain actively involved in programming and development. For the first time since the COVID-19 pandemic, the out-of-state camping trip resumed, and a group of teens and staff traveled to the Smoky Mountains for outdoor activities, including whitewater rafting.

Expanding Impact Through Community Partnerships

West End School: In 2024, The Cabbage Patch experienced a new chapter of growth through a new partnership with West End School, a K–8 independent school in Louisville’s West End. Rooted in shared values, this collaboration reinforces our mission to build self-reliance and confidence in youth. West End School’s daily credo emphasizes dedication and personal responsibility—principles that mirror our own. Together, we’re expanding opportunities for boys to grow academically, socially, and emotionally in a nurturing environment.

Dare to Care: Our new partnership with Dare to Care Food Bank continues to ensure that every child at The Patch receives a nutritious evening meal, fueling focus, growth, and positive behavior. Since launching in September 2024, rising demand has increased meal service, highlighting the program’s vital impact.



STRENGTHENING FAMILIES AND INSPIRING GENERATIONS

Bridging the Gap for Families

In 2024, the Family Development Department bridged the gap for families by providing vital resources through seasonal and year-round programs, serving hundreds with compassion and care. These numbers demonstrate how we serve and support our youth and families.



Patch Parents Dinner

Back to School Program (equipping students to start strong)

- * 122 children and youth from 56 families received backpacks and school supplies

Holiday Assistance Programs (keeping families financially balanced)

- * Thanksgiving Program

Bringing It Full Circle

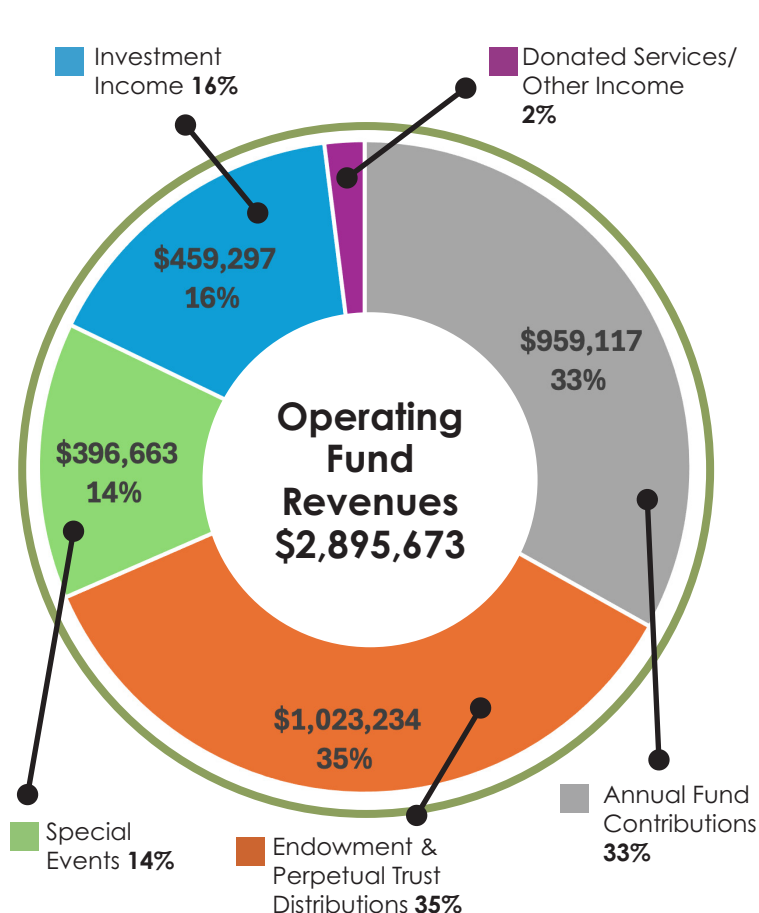
Many of our successful Cabbage Patch alumni graduate with the strong desire to give back. Nina Collins grew up as a Patch kid, participating in summer camps, the Teen Leader program and The Girls Club. Nina then became a College Scholar and graduated from Xavier University, having majored in Chemistry. Next she earned two additional graduate degrees from Vanderbilt University and from the University of Kentucky School of Pharmacy. Now living in Louisville and working as a pharmacist, things came full circle for her this past December. Nina generously sponsored a family of four for the Christmas Partner program, making Christmas a reality for a family in need. “I wanted to give something back to an organization that helped me so much,” Nina shared. “I don’t think I would be the person I am today without the experience I had at The Cabbage Patch.” Stories like Nina’s remind us that The Patch not only nurtures a lifelong service mindset, but also creates ripple effects of positive change that extend far beyond one Patch kid.



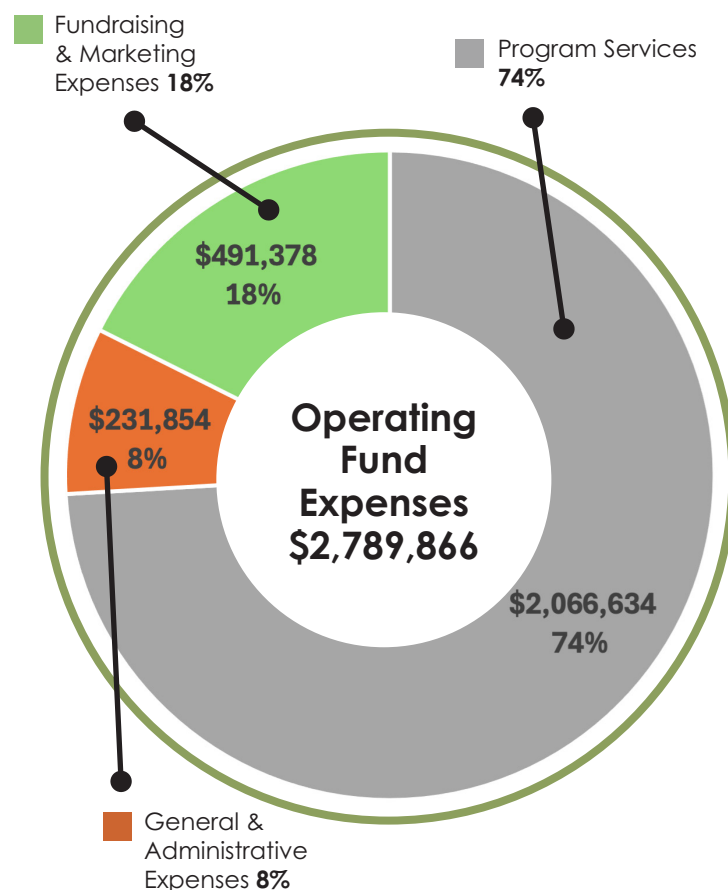

During the year, the Perpetual Trusts distributed \$359,588 to Cabbage Patch operations, while the value of the Trusts increased by \$709,523.

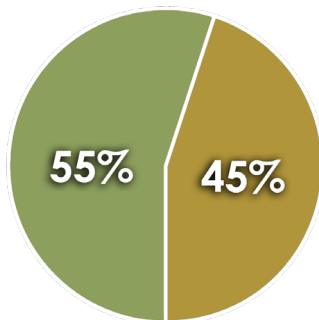
THE CABBAGE PATCH BY THE NUMBERS

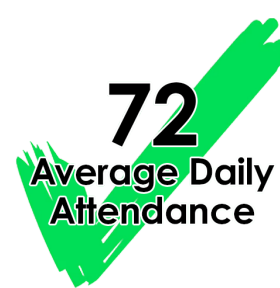

Following the Right Path: Volunteer Spotlight on Mickey Brown

If you want proof that The Cabbage Patch Settlement House may be one of Louisville's best kept secrets, just ask Board of Directors President, Mickey Brown. Though she grew up in Louisville and has been active in several other community organizations and nonprofits, she admits she had never heard of The Cabbage Patch until her friend introduced her in 2018. "I think I was kind of upset with myself that I didn't actually know more about The Patch in the first place, but I was amazed at what goes into it," she shared.

Once Mickey saw The Patch for herself, she was ready to jump in with both feet and began serving on the Board of Directors soon after. "I felt right away that it was a great organization with very caring people who want to provide a positive environment that is safe and that parents who bring their children here know their kids will be well cared for," she explained.

Mickey's real passion—in her professional life and at The Cabbage Patch—is college and career counseling. She is on a mission for everyone to find their path in life and, ultimately, to be happy in whatever they do for a career. "To help people figure out what it is that they're really good at, that they're really passionate about and what makes them happy is my goal for anybody that's thinking about a career," she explained. Thanks to the dedicated mentorship and financial support of The Cabbage Patch, the College Scholars Program has been a huge success in helping Patch kids find their way. This year, 39 scholars have been awarded nearly \$281,000 in scholarships to help pay their way through school.

During her six years on the board, she's served on several committees, including the Board Development Committee, the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee and the committee for the career development center project. Now serving as the board president, she is particularly excited about seeing the career development center come to fruition. For Brown, it's another way for The Cabbage Patch to live out its mission to empower children and families to reach their full potential. "When Patch kids finish high school and go to college or trade school, and get special training and start their job, we have helped change their life forever," she said. "They have a direction, they have a plan." Or, to put it another way, it's profoundly changing the lives of children and families in the community.
