At The Cabbage Patch, we are grateful for the partnership of friends and supporters who make this ministry possible. Your generosity helps open doors for young people and their families, strengthening a ministry that has served Louisville for more than a century.

In 2025, The Patch experienced a year of growth and development. Expanding access to our programs remains central to our mission. With the addition of a newly purchased van, we are now transporting youth from three partner schools. Our relationship with The West End School continues to flourish. In addition to the elementary school boys, 25 to 45 middle school young men now join us regularly during the week. Within Jefferson County Public Schools, we continue our longstanding partnership with Cochran Elementary, located just down the street, and have also begun a new partnership with Lincoln Elementary Performing Arts School.


While welcoming new participants is important, we know the young people who benefit most are those who attend consistently — 10 or more times each month. Building strong relationships with our staff and encouraging that level of engagement remains a key priority.

Our summer programs were another highlight of the year. Camps were well attended in 2025, and enrollment is already underway for summer 2026. Offerings will again include 22 different sports, activities, and travel camps; weekly swimming; a summer-long education camp; and afternoon programs with lunch included.

Guiding our work is The Patch Way — our commitment to excellence grounded in Jesus' call to love God and neighbor, and expressed through our values of communication, care, and trust. These values are lived out today just as in the time of our founder, Louise Marshall. As she wrote in 1941 about our mission, "We seek to help each individual to know what their abilities are and to help them to develop them to the fullest."

Thank you for supporting The Cabbage Patch as we continue investing in the lives and futures of Louisville's young people to create a community transformed by hope and opportunity.

STRENGTHENING FAMILIES AND INSPIRING GENERATIONS

A Summer of Learning, Purpose, and Play!

When summer break hits, The Cabbage Patch kicks into high gear, offering an engaging lineup of camps and programs aimed at cultivating curiosity, inspiring creativity, combating summer learning loss, and, of course, having lots of fun! Last summer, Patch kids dove into 22 themed camps over eight weeks. They learned to swim, pitched tents, created art, tried new games and sports, made new friends, and much more.

The Cabbage Patch's one-of-a-kind S.T.R.E.A.M. program was revamped in its second year, with a special emphasis on reading and math. It also allowed more opportunities for deep learning and flexibility if students needed more time on a subject or concept.

The changes paid off, with 90% of students improving in math and 100% of students improving in reading.

In 2025, we served 217 children and youth through summer camps and daily programming, with an additional 25 kids attending the S.T.R.E.A.M. program. Fundamentally, we believe every child deserves a great summer experience, with chances to learn, grow, explore, and form core memories that last a lifetime!



Cabbage Patch Renovations Put Youth Front and Center

With buildings dating back to 1929, The Cabbage Patch campus needs renovation and refurbishment from time to time. Thanks to recent generous capital grants from the Barr, Etscorn, and Woosley Foundations, the administrative office got a much-needed update in 2025.

Perhaps the most notable improvement was to the conference room. This space is The Patch's central meeting place for community visitors, board members, staff, and also youth members.

The physical updates were important and simplified the room with clean lines and paneling installed, new lighting, and the refinishing of original hardwood flooring. But it was the other changes that made this renovation shine. The conference room now showcases pieces of art created by our very own youth. They are displayed in upscale art frames complete with detailed placards like you would find in an art gallery.

Executive Director Corey Miller shared, "we wanted this renovation to create a functional space with an art gallery feel in this highly trafficked room that both elevates and celebrates the work of our talented youth."

In addition to the art frames, there is also a display showcasing pottery and 3D art fashioned by other youth. All of these creations are a direct result of our expanded visual arts programs, including new summer camps and more creative art opportunities. Together they develop and expand the budding talents of our members.



As at most galleries, the art will rotate so we can showcase even more Patch artists. Next time you're at The Patch drop by the conference room to take a look!

GROWING LEADERS

Investing in Our Teens

Teen leadership continues to nurture hardworking young people at The Patch, giving them opportunities for leadership development, job skills, and growth. Highly motivated youth ages 12 and older can become Teen Leaders, assisting in program areas and receiving a monthly stipend. Teens 14 and older who demonstrate exceptional initiative can become Teen Employees, taking on expanded responsibilities and gaining job readiness skills while earning regular paychecks.

Cabbage Patch staff work with teens to develop leadership and communication skills, build confidence, and learn accountability. A new partnership brings together University of Louisville students with the Society for the Prevention of Aggressiveness and Violence Among Adolescents (SPAVA), staff, and Teen Leaders to learn healthy boundaries each week.



It is no accident that one-third of our current College Scholars were once Teen Leaders. The skills they develop at The Patch are a strong foundation for college and career success, and the relationships they build with staff continue into adulthood.

Nurturing Deep Relationships

We know that the more often Patch members spend time at The Patch, the more successful they become in life — because deep relationships are built that help guide and support them long-term.



That is why staff launched the VIP (Very Involved Patchers) program this school year with the goal of encouraging regular attendance. Patch kids who attend 15 days per month get to enjoy the exclusive VIP party each month and once a quarter, the youth who attend the most days get to be program director for the day!

We have already celebrated two youth program directors for their consistent attendance: Jonathan and Za'Kiyah. The program has been a resounding success in its first year, with an average of 43 youth actively engaged each month.

Measuring Our Success

The Cabbage Patch Core Competencies were fully implemented this year as a blueprint for growth. These elements are part of a larger effort to evaluate the success in our youth programs. We are tracking youth feedback and seeing strong, consistent growth.

Cabbage Patch youth reported an **average of 4.5 out of 5 in pride and feeling supported.**

Members reported high scores (4.6 average out of 5) to the statement, **"The Cabbage Patch makes me feel better prepared for my future."**

Patch youth reported a **25% average increase** in understanding college application steps and an **50% average increase** in career development and budgeting confidence.

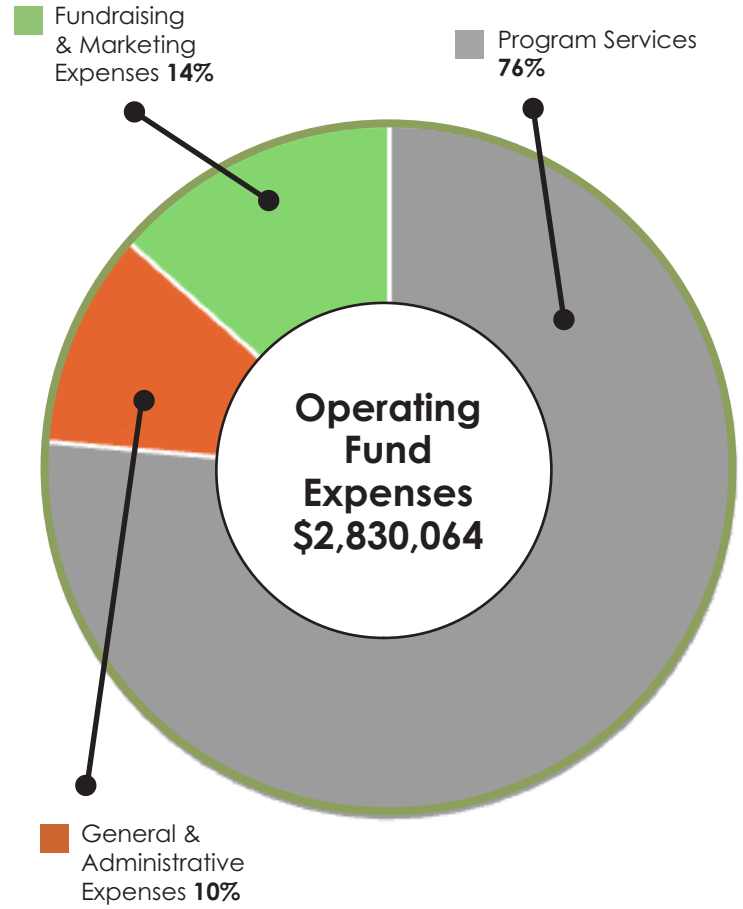
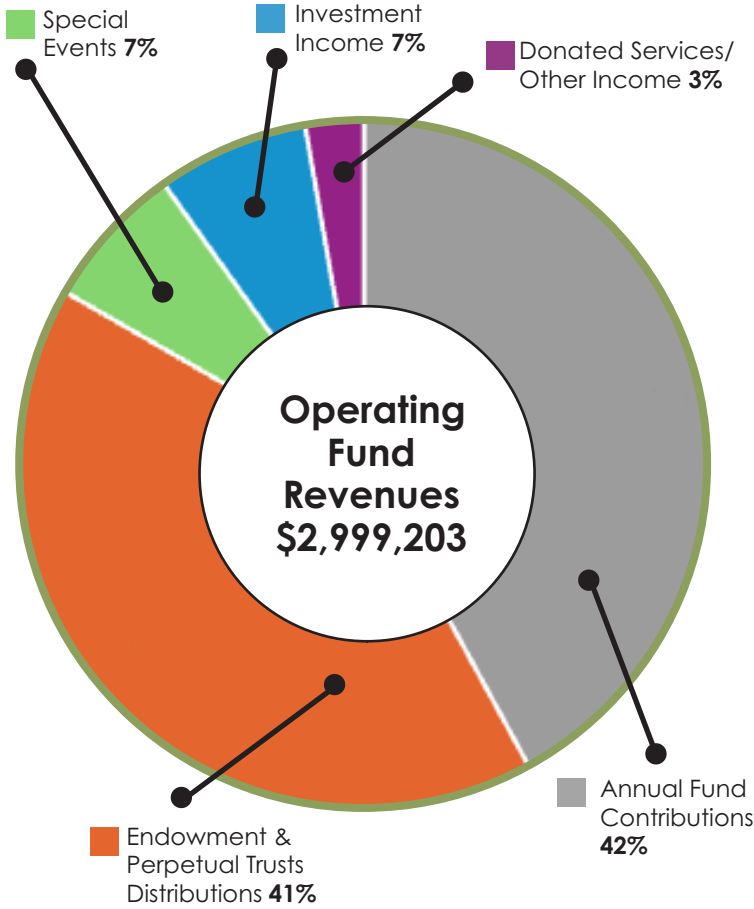
100% of surveyed members indicated that **attending The Patch makes them healthier and more active.**

Total Assets at April 30, 2025 were \$33,318,614, including \$19,383,215 in Investments and \$9,121,224 in Perpetual Trusts.

For the year, Net Investment Income was \$2,101,552. Endowment Net Assets increased by \$1,625,707.

During the year, the Perpetual Trusts distributed \$371,373 to Cabbage Patch operations, while the value of the Trusts increased by \$609,352.

The Cabbage Patch is a BBB Accredited Charity meeting all 20 Standards for Charity Accountability and adheres to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP).

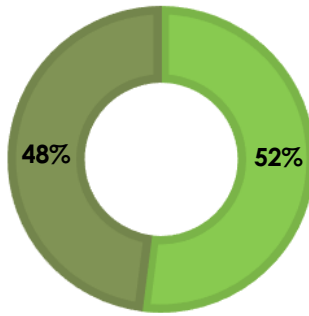

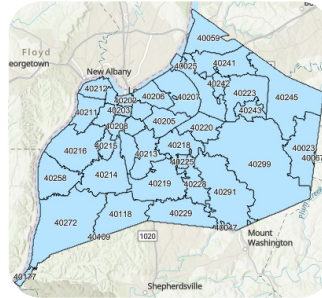

Staff Spotlight on Brandi Giles

One of the remarkable strengths of The Cabbage Patch is the quality, consistency, and longevity of the staff. Director of Programs Brandi Giles has been a steadfast presence at The Patch for over 10 years, impacting hundreds of children through her caring leadership.

Brandi first came to The Cabbage Patch in 2014 and began volunteering in the Education Department. She found it perfectly suited her love for teaching and passion to help others. “I loved that I could teach kids without having to overwhelm them with unnecessary information, that you could build a relationship, and they can really understand what it’s like to have the support of another adult,” she shared.

Brandi sees her role as filling in the gaps wherever needed, a quality that has driven her passion and her path at The Cabbage Patch. “I know that it is important to meet needs and fill gaps. If I see a gap, I’m going to immediately try to fill it.” And when a gap arose for someone to work in the Game Room in February 2015, Brandi jumped into fill it.

Brandi has continued to demonstrate strong leadership, a drive for excellence, and love for children which has fueled her promotions over the years. Now as the director of programs, she loves working with her team.

Brandi leads with a deep commitment to meeting the evolving needs of the children and families served by The Cabbage Patch. Under her leadership, her team responds with intention and care. A new reading group has been launched to help students succeed academically and the Teen Leaders program focuses more heavily on leadership, job readiness, and accountability. Even as program director, Brandi remains approachable and present, keeping her door open for anyone in need of a listening ear.



She is grateful for the support of a talented and positive staff working alongside her. “The community of staff is really strong here,” she noted. The Patch is blessed with excellent staff who are in it for the long haul — the average employee tenure is over seven years. Brandi believes that is one of the secrets of success at The Cabbage Patch, because it takes time to build trust with children and families. But once trust is established, families keep bringing their children back, building on the relationships with trusted staff.

Through it all, Brandi is still driven by the mission of The Cabbage Patch to serve children and families. “The Cabbage Patch supports positive growth into adulthood because it gives people the resources, the help, and the time with each other,” she shared. “They are getting doses every day of growth, of how to be respectful to each other, how to be accountable, how to not be overwhelmed with your emotions. It is a safe environment where you can make mistakes, and you get another chance. That is what makes The Cabbage Patch unique and special.”

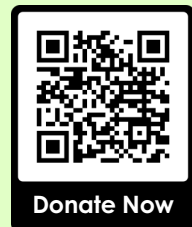
